WHAT ARE LIFELINE UTILITIES?

Lifeline utilities provide infrastructure services to the community. These include water, wastewater, transport, energy and telecommunications.

The Civil Defence Emergency Management Act 2002 identifies the following Bay of Plenty organisations and companies as lifeline utilities:

- Rotorua, Tauranga and Whakatane airports,
- · Port of Tauranga,
- Producers, suppliers or distributors of manufactured or natural gas (in a network or bottles larger than 20kg),
- Electricity generators or network distributors,
- · Suppliers or distributors of water to inhabitants,
- Providers of a wastewater or sewerage network or disposal of sewage or stormwater,
- Telecommunications network providers,
- Road network providers,
- · Producers, processors, or distributors of petroleum products to bulk and retail customers, and
- · Rail network or service providers.


